1. So often we default to compartmentalizing our lives. Why is that? How are you specifically prone to compartmentalizing?
2. Even Paul used his "day job" as a tent maker and his relationships with neighbors to make disciples. Do you overlook the obvious relationships you have already that could lead to making disciples? What are your challenges to doing something with those relationships?
3. Not only did Paul use day-to-day life to make disciples, he also leveraged Sabbath at the synagogue, or in our culture Sunday at church. Regardless of your volunteer team or even if you are yet on a volunteer team, how can you use Sundays to play a role in you helping OneLife make disciples? What can you look for to be part of "convincing" people like Paul did in verse 4?
4. Verses 9-10 give us great hope on many levels. How does it bring comfort to you to know that even Paul needed reassurance? What role does fear play in your own life in terms of being a disciple that makes disciples?
5. Discuss as a group your biggest hang-ups that keep you from developing relationships that could lead to you being a true disciple maker. Then discuss how you as a group can hold each other accountable to change what you care about in these areas.
