# **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FROM HANDOUT (35 Minutes)**

## **Jog Your Memory:**

- Many of us are just mimicking prayer, we are saying words out loud or in our minds, but they are not being led by the Holy Spirit
- · Pray without ceasing
- · You're too busy not to see the Holy Spirit in every opportunity
- The Holy Spirit draws people to himself, it's not a result of human effort

- 1. What is something that you tried to do on your own, but you should have asked for help or had someone with you? Was it moving a heavy object? A DIY project around the house? How did it turn out? Why did you choose to do it alone? How would it have turned out differently with another person around?

We've all done it. We've all tried to move something heavy, climbed a ladder or drive a long distance by ourselves. This first question is just one to whet everyone's appetite for discussion and share a (hopefully) humorous story about doing trying to do it ourselves. When it comes to our prayer life, and our relationship with the Holy Spirit in general, sometimes we try to do it alone, and that doesn't work. Listen carefully as your group shares, you might be able to relate later points back to some of these examples form the group.

2. What are common things that you pray for? Have you ever prayed and it was unanswered? Did you give up on this prayer? 1 Thessalonians 5:17 says to pray without ceasing. What does this mean to you? How is "praying without ceasing" different than what you were taught? If more Christians were to pray without ceasing, how would it change our world? Our community? Our church?

Religion ruins prayer. For so many of us, religion has reduced our prayer life down to a 30 minute spot in our morning routine - less than that if we're really honest. As this sermon series is showing us, prayer is much more than a reserved time to "talk" to God or a rehearsal of your favorite wrote prayer. It's a constant awareness of the Holy Spirit throughout your busy day.

Help your group begin to discuss and dream what it would be like for us to live out our busy days in tune with the Holy Spirit. What would that look like personally and practically?

#### Here are some ideas:

- Prayer would look like listening, not just talking.
- Prayer would result in responding to what God says, not just waiting on God to respond to what you say.
- Prayer would reflect what's important to God, not just what's important to you.
- 3. Read John 6:44 and 6:63. What does it mean to be drawn by the Holy Spirit? Sometimes people try to gain closeness with God by themselves (without the Holy Spirit), why doesn't this work? What are some common ways people try to get close to God on their own? What advice would you give to a person who is busy trying to grow without the Holy Spirit? If the Holy Spirit is the one who draws people to himself, what is our role in reaching others?

We often stunt our grown spiritually because we attempt to formulate the perfect spiritual recipe of reading, meditation, prayer, singing, conversation, etc. Before we know it, we're trying to "get back to how things were," because we've taken our focus off of the Holy Spirit and we're trying to grow on our own, and the Bible tells us that it doesn't work that way! Real spiritual change takes place when the Holy Spirit draws a person to himself.

Help your group discuss that we can do the busy work of praying, reading, and sharing our faith in vein because we sometimes do that without the Holy Spirit. Think about the example of the Pharisees. They loved to be busy learning, praying and sacrificing; but, it was all for nothing because it was without the Holy Spirit. Help your group discuss and dream about how things are different when the Holy Spirit is prompting and leading all aspects of our lives.
